From The Principal

Kia ora koutou

Thanks to everyone for your support of our school swimming programme over the last 2 weeks. It's been great to see the majority of our students swimming and making great progress in their abilities and understanding of water safety. Given that New Zealand is made up of islands and we are surrounded by water, it's incredibly important that our students learn to swim. The last swim is tomorrow.

Unfortunately we had to move our annual picnic from Days Bay to Avalon Park because of the weather but the students still had a great, fun day and it was wonderful to see so many whanau coming along and getting involved. Have a look at a few photos from the day below.

TOMORROW **Thursday 27th February** we are having Getting to Know You meetings with all whanau. This is an opportunity for you to tell us more about your child and your whanau and how we can work together to support each other. We aim for 100% attendance at these meetings as they are a really important part of us meeting the needs of your children. It's also a chance to start talking about goals for reading, writing, maths and the school values. Wendy has sent out an invitation for you to make a time for these meetings. Please note that school finishes at 1.00pm and you need to complete the SignMee notice to tell us whether your child/ren has permission to go home or is required to stay at school until 3.00pm. We have also been donated a number of Heart Kids Day Out Variety Show which is on at Sacred Heart College in Lower Hutt at 6.00pm on Wednesday 11th March. If you would like free tickets, please come and see me in the office.

Students can earn signatures on a WOW passport that can be redeemed for prizes when they are full. If your child/ren walks, bikes or scooters to school they can ask a staff member to sign their passport for them. They can also use the school bikes to earn signatures and if they exercise at home just send us a note or photo and they can earn more. It would be great to see people getting active as part of their Pride Challenges during March. There is also a colouring competition for students to enter with some great prizes.



A message from your school public health nurse Firstly, welcome back to the new school year. I hope you all had an enjoyable and restful holiday, and ready for a great year of learning and new experiences.

For those children who have asthma diagnosed by a doctor, it is important that your child has an Asthma Action Plan completed by your doctor and is shown to the school office, The school staff will take a copy and refer to this should your child suffer an asthma attack at school. It is also very important that the school have your child's prescribed inhalers and not be expired; expiry date can be checked by pulling out the canister from the inhaler and checking on the canister the date noted next to "Exp.".)


