From The Principal

Kia ora koutou

Welcome back to another busy term. I hope that you all enjoyed some quality time with your children and that everyone is well rested and ready to get back into learning. A special welcome to Kris Birchall-Harrison (Mrs Harrison) who is the new teacher in Nga Whetu and Ally Tatafu who is a new teacher aide working with some of our migrant students. It is great to have you both on staff and we are really looking forward to getting to know you better.

This term is a very busy one with our main Curriculum Concept being Changes of matter with strong links to kitchen chemistry and the science behind our Matariki hangi. Literacy, The Arts and Technology will all be linked to the concept and Maths also fits really nicely with a focus on multiplication / division and measurement. The PE / Sports focus for the term is cross country and attacking and defending. Students will be participating in a school cross country event in the next few weeks.

The Paid Union Meeting that was supposed to have happened last term is now happening next Tuesday 7th May at 1.30pm. Most of our staff will be attending this meeting but we have enough staff to stay ant school and keep the school open. This means that students will NOT go home for the afternoon.

Breakfast Club is now running 4 days a week, Monday to Thursday 8.15am-8.45am. It's a great opportunity for children and their whanau to sit down together and have breakfast and catch up with each other. If you are able to volunteer your time to help run Breakfast Club please let us know in the office.

The JittaBugz van is available to pick students up from Naenae Primary between 8.15-8.20am and from BP Waiwhetu about 8.30am. If you would like a ride you just need to sign a permission form in the office and then use the van when you need to.

A reminder that the disability carpark at the front of the school is only for cars with a mobility card. It has been put in place to help our families that need support get easy access to the school so please do not use this park if you don't have a disability card. Also a reminder to please not use the school driveway for drop offs and pickups.

This term we are opening up Te Wāhi Wātea which is a space in our library for our school community to come and chill out, chat with other whanau members, have a cup of tea or coffee, read a book or look at some of the Pride Challenge entries. We will also have a computer available to use between 9.00am - 3.30pm Monday to Friday in the school library and free access to our school wifi between 9.00am-5.00pm. The computer is set up for you to easily access SeeSaw and SignMee so that you can catch up on your children's learning and newsletters and information. Please come along any time to make use of this facility.

SeeSaw is an app that we use to share the students learning with you. Teachers and students can share text, photos and videos of what's happening at school with you during the day. Please download the app from Google Play or the App Store. We will be running some workshops after school over the next few weeks to help you get setup if you need help. Teachers all have instructions and a QR code for your child/ren but we can help out if necessary to get you signed up.

Measles

As many may have seen there have been cases of Measles in Dunedin, Christchurch, Rangiora and Auckland., although there are no known cases within the Wellington region.

Measles patients are infectious 5 days before and until 5 days after the rash appears, which means they can pass the disease on before they realise they are unwell.

Most people born in the 1970s and 1980s will have been offered one dose of measles vaccine as children. Those born from the 1990s onwards may have been offered two doses, if you are not sure how many doses you have had, talk to your doctor as the information may be in your medical records. If you cannot demonstrate immunity or have not had two doses, vaccination is recommended provided you have no contraindications (such as pregnancy).

A message from your school public health nurse Firstly, welcome back to the new school year. I hope you all had an enjoyable and restful holiday, and ready for a great year of learning and new experiences.

For those children who have asthma diagnosed by a doctor, it is important that your child has an Asthma Action Plan completed by your doctor and is shown to the school office, The school staff will take a copy and refer to this should your child suffer an asthma attack at school. It is also very important that the school have your child's prescribed inhalers and not be expired; expiry date can be checked by pulling out the canister from the inhaler and checking on the canister the date noted next to "Exp.".)


